2. Where and how much specifically would you cut costs, and what are the opportunity costs of doing so?
3. What specific ideas will you advocate for economic revitalization?
4. What are your plans to encourage residential revitalization in Harrisburg?
5. What green and sustainable infrastructure would you propose?
6. What policies would you advocate to encourage developers to build in the City?
7. What are your thoughts on the rights of entrepreneurs to open marijuana shops in the City when Pennsylvania legalizes medicinal marijuana?
8. If elected, what will you do to encourage businesses to come to Midtown, specifically, and Harrisburg, generally, to encourage the development of vacant and blighted properties?
9. What are your thoughts about the potential use of eminent domain to acquire the public works facility? When is eminent domain appropriate?
10. We are limited in taxes and fees we can levy and our property taxes can't be increased much without population shift. How do you propose we grow our tax base with additional residents without displacing existing ones?

4. How would you work to ensure consistent state funding of safety expenses?
5. What could you do on Council to break the concentration of poverty in Harrisburg?
6. How would you address the problem of litter in the City?
7. What is your opinion on converting Second Street from one way to two ways?
8. What are your thoughts on adding a bridge connecting Division Street to Industrial Road?
9. What is your opinion on so-called "nuisance bars" and what can and should be done about them?
10. How would you address the various divides prevalent in the City?
11. What can City Council do for issues affecting the Hispanic community?

8. What have you done to prepare to be a member of City Council? How many Council meetings have you attended in the last year?
9. Name something current Council has done that you believe is impactful.
10. What will you personally do to improve cooperation between City Council and the mayor's office and other elected offices to benefit the City?
11. Considering issues over which City Council has substantial authority, what is the biggest issue facing the City and how will you work to fix it?
12. What practical things do you suggest residents can do each day to make the City better? How would you motivate residents to do these things?
13. What is your opinion on regionalization of services, such as police, fire, schools, or even governance?
14. How can City Council better collaborate with other municipal entities, businesses, and organizations for the betterment of Harrisburg?
